TREEHOUSE TALES Tours for Elementary Schools

Bring your students and Step into a Story® at Treehouse Children's Museum. Field trips at Treehouse are educational, engaging, and playful. Eight different tours are offered for Kindergarten through 5th grade classes. Schools from Ogden and Weber District are free, thanks to their District Foundations!

Every Treehouse tour includes:

- **EXHIBIT TALES:** Students experience an award-winning exhibit up close through interactive storytelling and discussion.
- THEATER TALES: We'll bring the tour theme to life through an interactive ParticiPlay® in our Simmons Storybook Theater.
- ART TALES: Students create their own story through a themed visual art project in the Art Garden.
- **EXPLORATION TIME:** Students have about 20 minutes to explore one or two other exhibits while supervised by their adult chaperones.



FAIRY TALES: Your students will discover the magic of the stories of the Brothers Grimm, Charles Perrault, and other traditional fairy tales from around the world, and hear some new stories, too.

Recommended for Kindergarten and up.



HOMETOWN HEROES: Meet us on Main Street for a focus on the contributions of local heroes and community helpers, and the citizenship and community objectives of the State Core.

Perfect for Kindergarten, but recommended for K through 2nd Grade.



WALK IN THE WOODS: Take your students into the Woods as they learn about Utah plants and animals, seasonal changes in the natural world, who lives in the pond or the cave or the summer meadow.

Recommended for K through 2nd Grade.



CASTLES & LEGENDS: Your class can travel back in time with us to the "Days of the Knights" and hear about castle life, chivalry, knights, armor, and King Arthur.

Recommended for 1st Grade and up.



WORLD TALES: The One World Village Gallery exhibit at Treehouse means your students can explore several cultures with us and the folktales that children in those countries know and love.

Recommended for 2nd Grade and up.



UTAH TALES: Take a look at our state's heritage and geography through Treehouse's Rodeo Arena and Barn, the One Room Schoolhouse, our Native American artifact collection, and our Mapping Utah exhibit.

Perfect for 4th Grade but recommended for 2nd Grade and up.

AMERICAN TALES: Students learn about the American Presidents and the Oval Office, use the Treehouse Printing Press to print copies of the Declaration of Independence, explore all 50 states on the Great American Map, and share a tall tale.

Perfect for 5th Grade, but recommended for 3rd Grade and up.



HOLIDAYS OF LIGHT: The Holidays of Light tour at Treehouse explores holiday traditions from around the world through art, theater, and story. Available exclusively from Tuesday, November 13 through Friday. December 21 this year.

Recommended for 1st through 5th Grades.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR TOURS are designed with learning in mind. Unique literature, art, and theater activities – centered around the Museum's award-winning exhibits – compliment classroom lessons and directly tie to learning outcomes identified in the State Core Curriculum in Language Arts, Theater, Visual Arts, and Social Studies.

- School tours can be scheduled Tuesdays through Fridays. Morning slots are 9:30 a.m. 11:30 a.m. and afternoon slots are 12 to 2 p.m. Just call 801-394-9663 or visit www.treehousemuseum.org to request a tour.
- Treehouse can accommodate school groups of 20 to 110 students. Groups larger than 40 students may be divided among up to three tour guides. Treehouse may schedule smaller groups at the same time.
- Please bring one adult for every 5 children. Because Treehouse is open to the public during tour times, groups who do not provide an enough chaperones to adequately supervise their students will not have free exploration time, and their tour may be 20 minutes shorter.
- Treehouse is wheelchair accessible.
- Cost for schools with a reservation is \$5 per student (teachers and chaperones are FREE). Treehouse Membership Cards are NOT valid on School Tours since payment is in bulk and discounted. Treehouse accepts credit cards, school checks, or district purchase orders.
- Groups from Weber County and Ogden City School Districts receive FREE school tour admission thanks to generous underwriting from the Weber School District Foundation and the Ogden School Foundation.
