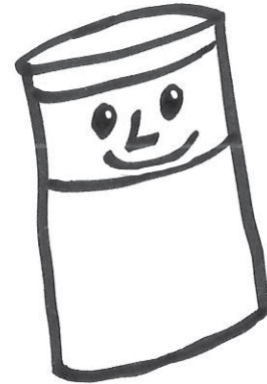


## Marilyn's Tube Puppets!

### *Materials You Need:*

- Construction Paper
  - for finger puppets 4 1/2 inches by 6 inches
  - for arm puppets 9 inches by 12 inches
- Scotch Tape
- Markers or crayons
- Glue
- Scissors
- Paper Scraps for decorating
- Imagination!!!!



### *Making Finger Puppets:*

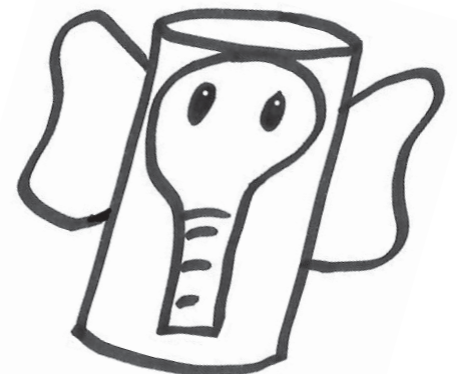
1. Roll the paper loosely around your finger and fasten it with tape lengthwise.
2. Establish a character by decorating your tube.

For a human wrap a strip of paper around to make a place for a face. Draw on features and hair or glue on yarn, ribbon, paper strips for the hair.

For an elephant make ears, a trunk, and maybe a peanut!

For a giraffe, use extra long paper (9 inches by 6 inches) and then draw a face and glue or draw on spots.

For a horse, put the tube on its side, cut a hole in the new bottom, attach a head at one end, a tail at the other, plus a mane and legs, of course.



### *Making Arm Puppets:*

It's the same idea as finger puppets, except bigger!

### *Combinations:*

You can combine the two kinds of tube puppets to create great story ideas, such as "Jack and the Beanstalk," "Rapunzel" in a puppet tower, and "Hansel and Gretel" with a tall gingerbread house. As you get in the swing, more and more ideas will come.
